3. END WITH AN ASK - what the Minister should do – Introduce a regularisation

I urge you, as Minister for Justice and Equality, to introduce a regularisation scheme and give undocumented people like me an opportunity to come forward. We have struggled for so long. Like the Irish undocumented in the US and Australia we just want a chance.

- Regularisation doesn't need a new law. This is a simple scheme.
- Doing this will help stop the exploitation of hard working people like me.
- It will bring in a lot of money for the economy through taxes and immigration fees.
- It will allow people to live free from fear and anxiety.
- My children growing up here have the right to hope for a future. Ireland is their home.
- It's the right thing to do and it's the smart thing to do.
- We are the future voters of tomorrow. We have a contribution to make. Let us make it.
