"My 5 year old daughter who was born here and my eldest who is 11 have never seen each other. They could finally meet as sisters and I could breathe easily for the first time in 10 years."





"Sometimes when I am at the bus stop a group have directed racial insults towards me and thrown things at me whilst laughing. If I got my status I would be able to report this safely, not just for my good but for the whole community."





Undocumented people are at the heart of our communities but do not have a pathway to papers. As friends, neighbours and co-workers we need to offer a clear and fair solution.



No one should be left behind. This regularisation must be broad and inclusive for workers, for children and for families. People cannot wait any longer.

"To get my papers, I call it 'paperised' would be a dream come true. I won't have to worry every time there is a knock at the door. I'll finally feel safe in my home."
